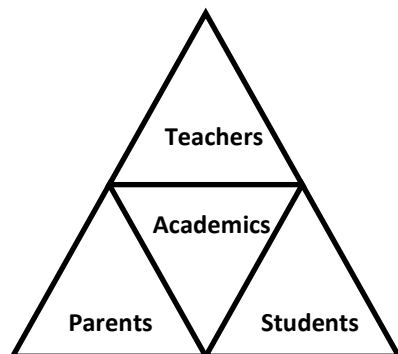
Effective Compacts:

- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom.
